<p>1. Welcome and Updates on Current Research Projects</p>	<p>Discussion on exploring different times to meet to accommodate global time zones. Petra and I will try to strategize better times to meet for the 2018. Rotating times, potentially every other month, to allow more opportunity for others to attend.</p> <p><u>Cindy</u>: Still awaiting finalization of grant funding. Exploring submitting another grant. Working on manuscripts and IRB.</p> <p><u>Lindsay</u>: 2 projects ongoing on 1) adolescent young mothers evaluation and school health nursing evaluation. Finishing data collection. Beginning analysis.</p> <p><u>Birte</u>: EU grant is waiting for an April 2018 decision. Article on family functioning and social support measurement validation in Danish now published in Scandinavian Journal of Caring Sciences. Another article on Family Management Measure (FaMM) validation accepted for publication. (Great news for the Global Connections.)</p> <p><u>Sonja</u>: Two manuscripts are in review. The community-based participatory research group has 2 studies being reviewed by NIH now on: 1) healthy immigrant communities, which is a continuation of the healthy immigrant families study and 2) Boys and Girls Club, after school program to enhance nutrition and physical activity; including a caregiver engagement piece.</p> <p><u>Melanie</u>: Just received funding from HRSA: RCT testing an intervention with pregnant Hispanic mothers exploring maternal child outcomes in a semi-rural area. Previously finished a HRSA grant in 2016 studying urban Hispanic mothers with two manuscripts under review. Working on refining a breast-feeding intervention for WIC eligible families to obtain pilot data to resubmit for funding. Helping with analysis of focus groups from a hospice group.</p> <p><u>Sandra</u>: Several projects: Working with Sonja and another study on nurses practicing in acute care hospital setting. Working on identifying what changes can be proposed for the unit that are sustainable.</p>

Danford) Tentative plan: -Family functioning and family environment (Junko Honda) -Family Assessment and Advances in Teaching of Family (Elizabeth Coyne) - Family Health Conversations (Marie Louise Luttick)</p> <p>Blends family environment, teaching, and conversation with perspectives from Japan, Australia, and The Netherlands. Projected date in 2018, to allow not only more time to organize but also attention to global holidays (December, January events) thus allowing more participants to attend. Suggest beginning to mid February.</p>

Research Clusters: Family care in the ICU</p>	<p>Update: Sandra Eggenberger (USA), Wendi Smith (USA), Marion Mitchel (Australia), Petra Brysiewicz (South Africa)</p> <p>Present focus is primarily on ICU as a starting place then projecting to move into medical-surgical areas and others for long-term planning. The research proposal is nearly finished. Working on a measurement tool to accommodate data collection in multiple countries (projecting 5-6 countries). Meeting next week to finalize. Suggest submitting a brief summary to research news with updates as the research progresses.</p>
<p>6. Research cluster: Pediatrics</p>	<p>Update: Cindy Danford</p> <p>Planning our first meeting for future reporting.</p>
<p>7. Scientific development of family phenomena: Translation/implementation science regarding family nursing</p>	<p>Update – S. Eggenberger, E. Hagedoorn, B. Ostergaard</p> <p>Sandra and Birte will be meeting soon to think through the next steps and move this forward.</p>

Defining Family Nursing Manuscript development</p>	<p>Sonja and Cindy will be working on a strategy to advance manuscript development of the defining family nursing data presented in Denmark and Spain.</p> <p>Seeking a common mechanism for everyone to use to communicate. One Drive was determined to be a universal mechanism to use that is secure. Everyone on the call has access to One Drive and many have used this. Dropbox is known to sell your information and is not secure. Plan to explore “One Drive” possibilities. Sonja and Cindy will trial One Drive and then open up the folder to others.</p>
