Welcome and Updates on Current Research Projects and Insights from Pamplona (10 minutes)</p>	<p>Cindy Danford: Exploring family centered interventions to help families with preschool children establish healthy habits related to eating, activity, and sleep. Awaiting counsel review for an R21 NIH grant proposal using event history calendars to facilitate goal-setting. Working on proposal development for internal funding and manuscripts.</p> <p>Lindsay Smith: Project working with adolescent mothers & how resilience relates to family outcomes; Family outcomes from perspective of adolescents through home visits.</p> <p>Susan Sullivan-Bolyai: Grant resubmissions for 2 family related interventions: families with children with Type 1 diabetes using peer/team mentors with preteens and also families with children younger than 5 years. Diabetes self-management using simulators. Transitioning from NYU to U Mass, Wooster.</p> <p>Suzanne Feetham: Continuing work on one manuscript on state of the science related to the family functioning measure as the primary focus. At the request of Journal of Family Nursing, writing another manuscript on the criteria of research of families and what is needed in publications related to families.</p> <p>Wendi Smith: Teaching fulltime this summer; Working on</p>
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	<p>advancing progress on her dissertation proposal focusing on parents in the PICU. Data collection at Children's hospital.</p> <p>Summary: Pamplona was a fabulous conference. Please revisit how the content from Pamploma has informed your research.</p>

<p>3. Defining Family Nursing Survey Podium Presentation for IFNC13</p>	<p>Our conference presentation, "Defining Family Nursing: An International Perspective" went well. We had a full room of conference attendees participate in this podium presentation session, who also asked insightful questions. Lindsay commented that he learned a lot through the presentation and preparation process; emphasized good experience working with team and having this opportunity. Cindy commented that she appreciated the practice runs and Sonja's leadership/mentorship to bring the "story" of the content to clarity. Next step is manuscript preparation.</p>

Eggenberger, E. Hagedoorn, B. Ostergaard</p> <p>Sandra submitted an update via email: The translation /implementation science regarding family phenomena group has not made any progress. Continues to be on the plan to do in near future.</p>

Family interview methods for family research webinar planning (10 minutes) (Cindy Danford, Li-Chi Chang, & Norma Krumwiede in collaboration with the Nursing Education Committee)</p>	<p>Part 2 Week of September 18. State of the Science of Family Interviewing: A Collective Family Perspective (Speaker: Sandra Eggenberger & Sonja Meiers) – Webinar focus on family research and family intervention interviews with the collective family</p> <p>Part 3 Early November State of the Science of Family Interviewing: A Global Perspective (Speakers: Update C. Danford)</p> <p>The first session (State of the science of family interviewing: An individual perspective) by Kathy Knafl and Marcia VanRiper occurred in May and was a success. Now working on part 2 Date to be September 22nd. Final time TBD.</p> <p>Sandra sent in an update on the up and coming 2nd webinar via email which includes: Sonja and I are working on the family interviewing methods collective family perspective. Junko Honda recommended by Suzanne – Part of preconference on Family Environment assessment; Elizabeth Coyne, Griffith University from Australia. Work on family assessment and advances in teaching about family interviews.</p> <p>Need time for several meetings and confirming a date. Please forward more information to Cindy.</p>

Family care in the ICU</p>	<p>Sandra Eggenberger (USA), Wendi Smith (USA), Marion Mitchel (Australia), Petra Brysiewicz (South Africa) Update Next steps: Preparing proposal for IRB review and approval</p> <p>This group is focusing on the family perspective in acute and critical care settings. The group met on Tuesday, 7/18. Wendy summarized: Thinking about ICU population but need to verify whether we will include ICU environment and/or acute care areas as well. Presently plan to include all critical care areas considering whether there are notable differences between ICU families and critical care families. Exploring what we want to look at in the ICU setting related to the family experience. Suzanne recommended Debbie Wyband, U of Maryland, who has done extensive research in ICUs. Wendy and Cindy will pass this on to Sandra.</p> <p>Susan will forward information on an incoming PhD student (Tara Tehan) at Mass General and new IFNA member, who is interested in this group. Cindy will forward her email address to Sandra Eggenberger and the acute care group.</p> <p>Further update: Sandra submitted a written report since she could not attend this meeting: The family care in acute critical illness group have met and is developing overall project proposal and IRB etc etc. We have monthly meetings established with tasks set for next meeting. Excellent committed and dedicated group who are very excited and engaged.</p>

One area in pediatrics. Suja Somanadhan from Ireland and Lucia</p>

	<p>from Brazil. Working together on what direction we want to explore related to pediatrics. Wendy Smith expressed interest in joining this group.</p> <p>Other interest in a pediatric research group: Michelle Polfuss & Susan interested in forming a group or joining the peds group. Both are interested in families with children with Type 1 Diabetes; Lindsay is also interested given his expertise with adolescent and community family area.</p> <p>Discussed how pediatric care tends to be acute care hospital oriented and family care tends to be community oriented in Australia whereas in Canada child and family are bundled into acute care and community settings. In the US pediatrics encompasses age 0-18/21 years of age and includes multiple settings including primarily the primary care outpatient clinic, community settings, and acute care/critical care settings (hospital). For this group speculate focusing on the primary care and community settings since the acute care group is exploring what is happening in hospital setting is including pediatrics.</p> <p>Plan to set up doodle poll to convene.</p> <p>No other known groups other than the acute care group.</p>

Research News	<p>Thoughts for what we should share in August Global Connections</p> <p>Need to follow up with Sonja related to this endeavor; Seeking researchers to be highlighted in the IFNA newsletter. Suggested thinking of who to select from our group or others who would be appropriate to highlight? Lindsay is a possibility to consider later next year.</p>
10. Other	<p>Discussed developing a manuscript from our mixed method research. Questioned whether we have 1 or 2 manuscripts?</p> <p>Since our approach to the research has been mixed methods then one (1) manuscript was suggested. Consider organizing initially into one manuscript to capture the “story” and perspective first and then evaluate.</p> <p>Suzanne suggested that we potentially have 2 manuscripts overtime: 1. Advancing the science related to family nursing and 2. How IFNA, through International collaboration, has done this project. Recommended using APA author</p>

	<p>guidelines and following these to establish our process and identify responsibilities. Use of collaborator worksheets was also suggested. Further suggested exploring the difference in the final product (manuscript) related to the science given the international flavor; Our collaboration has lead to an enhanced message.</p> <p>How to start: Suggest using our presentation as an outline to proceed. First begin with a manuscript on advancing the science through our research and followed by a second manuscript highlighting our international collaboration incorporating research, presenting and manuscript writing.</p> <p>Break into components r/t background & intro, Results. Interest in moving forward on these areas. Kathy Anderson joined the meeting and suggested reviewing the background literature and where state of the science is now. Updating relevant literature, will also help with the discussion section (Kathy is happy to be involved & help pull this together: need lit search for background). We discussed Sonja's role as taking the lead as first or senior author as she prefers. Our intent for now is general discussion of ideas with more definitive planning in September. September was designated as better time to move forward with organization of the manuscript. It was suggested to utilizing students as well. All need to look for articles and student helpers.</p> <p>Overall need to conduct an updated literature search first as starting place: check articles related to state of the science on family; Drop box or repository for articles to be set up.</p> <p>Plan to reconvene with discussion in September.</p>
