Welcome and Updates on Current Research Projects and Insights from Pamplona (10 minutes)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cindy: Working on IRB for R21 Grant exploring use of event history calendars as a self regulation strategy for goal setting in families with young children; has not been to counsel yet (late Oct/Nov for answer); Submitted for internal grant; working on pilot data to support R01 resubmission. • Birte: EU Foundation resubmitted application including 15 countries trying to work together; expecting spring time decision • Helene: R21 previously funded by NICHD on home intervention for Veterans with TBI and their family members; looking to expand to Veterans and civilians with TBI; R01 is currently under review; Helene and colleague invited to U of Oslo where they are replicating intervention with civilians • Marie: Working with PhD students who are looking at young caregivers/adolescents caring for family members; work with addiction and familial support using CRAFT intervention; Developing a 5-day training on family health conversations to better organize care within family and whether it is cost effective • Susan: Moved from NYU back to UMass Medical in Wooster; brainstorming ways to resubmit R01; family related using MOST design and looking at innovative parent education and peer mentoring; Two grants: one for children under 6-years and one with preteens and parents: re-education with Type 1 diabetes. • Kathy: On sabbatical; will be reaching out to those in US on how we can re-energize family nursing in the US. Descriptive Qualitative design: Explore (1) family care across the continuum from early admission to discharge in hospital settings within a number of international countries (US, Switzerland, South Africa, and possibly New Zealand and Australia); (2) how nurses perceive they involve and engage families; (3) barriers; (4) facilitators; and (5) attributes of nurse-family partnerships and nurse-family engagement.
