Ostegaard: Two articles submitted for review regarding instrument validation and translation of Self-care and the Finnish family function, for family health and social support instrument. Translated and validated among Danish heart failure patients.• C. Danford: Research on family focused interventions using event history calendars to explore young children behavior. Writing an R01.• E. Dyce: Comparing clinic and ambulatory blood pressure monitoring.• E. Hagedoorn: Calling from Netherlands, visited IFNA conference as presenting author last year. One article in review in International Journal of Family Nursing, qualitative analysis regarding family caregiving discussion with nurses, caregivers, and the elderly. Also performing research on perceptions of nurses attitudes towards family in nursing care. Currently working on research on family caregivers and how they feel competent and prepared after a hospital admission of their loved one, how they feel

Meiers: Healthy Immigrant Families study; baseline measures article published; one article just accepted discussing treatment fidelity among of lay interventionists within the study. Twenty-four month data have been collected and analysis is pending; family intervention effective in enhancing nutrition quality among adults at the 6 month measure.• J. Deatruck: Will retire in July from university, working on project with long term survivors of childhood brain tumors, focusing on mothers but including the rest of the family as well• V Swallow et al; Children and young people with chronic kidney disease (CKD), parents and health professionals: a qualitative study of their views on desirable components for a developmentally appropriate, CKD-specific information and support software application• Lindsay Smith: Was asked by the Director of School Health Nurses in Tasmania to assist in evaluating the school health nurse program. This program began rolling out nurses in every primary and high school across Tasmania in June 2015 and to date has embedded approximately 10 nurses in various regions of highest need, each responsible for a number of schools in the region. Another 10 nurses will commence over the next 12 months. The evaluation that I will be involved in is to explore through qualitative stories the impact of the school
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	<p>health nurses. I will be asking school children, teachers and school principals what the school health nurse means to them. It is hoped that these real life stories will illuminate the quantitative evaluation of the process and early impact of the program.</p>
