Feetham recommended that hen we think about framing results of the study, it will be important to frame as “What does this mean for families?” with a focus on presenting solutions/strengths/family strengths and attributes. Subcommittee members wonder “Could we access use of country liaisons when we conduct future studies so that we are language conscious in our surveys”</p>
