	<p><u>Question 10</u> – Do nurses involve the family in nursing care in all areas of your country? Comments: minimal involvement; some new programs; discipline specific; family nursing, per se, is not being practiced</p> <p><u>Question 11</u> – 50%/50% family nursing not clearly, well defined; lack a systematic way; lack of consistency of application; site dependent or level (RN vs advanced practice; psych and pediatric settings); family as caregiver working with caregiver to help the family provide care for the patient; partnering with the family to provide care; lack of knowledge about family unit approach; <u>may</u> include the family; a few defined family as the unit of care or family as recipient of care</p> <p><u>Overall Q10 & 11</u>, family nursing seems to be about assisting the family to provide care for the patient or getting the family to help the nurse provide care for the patient</p> <p><u>Things to remember:</u> Compare to IFNA Practice Committee findings from 2013; Overall across questions: Family nursing is a developing practice; there is difference and different countries are exploring it differently; wide variety of development; Families want to be involved; sometimes as a unit and sometimes active in care of the patient; collectively and individually; we are evolving</p>
