1. Welcome	Please note the modification of the agenda. The agenda has been reformatted to highlight our focus on research and global collaboration. Sandra shared that the IFNA Board was suggesting to reformat the meeting minutes and that adding the mission of the group at the top would be helpful to attract new members.
2. Member Updates on Current Research Projects	<p>Cindy: Preparing to start data collection for R21 NIH Grant – working on standard operational procedures, remodifying event history calendar in electronic format. Working with a interdisciplinary team on developing a translational game for preschool children on healthy eating to offset childhood obesity. DNP student had manuscript submitted and accepted without revisions.</p> <p>Lindsay: Writing the evaluation for School Health Nursing project, which was started about 3 years ago. This has has been utilized across Tasmania to introduce a strengths family perspective into the school nursing program.</p> <p>Sandra: Ran a final stage in a hospital system to do a translational project that creates an academic practice partnership with nurses at the bedside; using stories heard on the unit in this project to present as an educational tool focused on family nursing practice. Now measuring perception of the nurses confidence in their ability to support and teach families. Working to create online module systems used for new nurses who join the unit. Also Working on a project with Sonja Meyers to create a tool to measure chronic illness and ways to talk with families to influence their efficiency of interventions for the patient with chronic illness. Goal a sustainable project.</p> <p>Julie: Faculty from Minnesota State and working towards her master’s in nursing education; BSN, MBA, Doctorate in Administrative Healthcare). Working with Sandra (presented in Spain) on Smartglass technology – students may be able to view their work in post conference. Used to teach students more efficiently fro reflection. Working on publishing.</p> <p>Petra: Working with student with families in Nigeria to collaborate and support teens-pregnancy patients – created a pamphlet that can be used by antenatal staff for pregnant women to give to family at home, which will lead to supporting the woman during pregnancy. Working with another student on partnering with families in ER to develop an intervention to show families how nurses can actively engage and partner with families in the ER.</p> <p>Suzanne: First blog on policy is on the IFNA site. and has started a second blog. Wants others to help add to the blog in preparation for the meeting in August in D.C. Would like to review the blog with everyone who will also be in the preconference meeting.</p>

1. Global perspective: Defining family	<i>A1. Manuscript Update: Sonja & Cindy</i> <i>Future plans – IFNA planning for Sonja, Manuscript in Final Stages</i> Manuscript in final stages of preparation for submission.
2. Family care in the ICU	<i>A2. Update: Sandra Eggenberger (USA), Petra Brysiewicz (South Africa)</i> Purpose: To discern nurses' descriptions and practices of family engagement in the adult intensive care units (ICUs) from a global perspective. Petra and Rahel have been instrumental in helping lead this project. Family Care in ICU group will share the process used at the conference in D.C. to help global groups set up their data analysis and address barriers. Presently working on data collection with small group interviews of nurses in the ICU setting. The nurses' perceptions on family engagement, barriers, and actions or steps they believe are helpful in working with the family as well as problems in carrying out interventions are being elicited in the interviews. At IFNC 14 the group will present initial findings and processes that will inform global research groups and give perspective on data analysis and findings. Two abstracts for IFNC 14: One abstract addresses research findings and a second abstract addresses lessons learned from collaboration across the world and guidelines for big research groups

4. Scientific development of family phenomena: Translation/ implementation science regarding family nursing	<i>A4. On hold: S. Eggenberger, E. Hagedoorn, B. Ostergaard</i> Noted that Sandra's work in the institute is focused on translational science. This may be translated to global perspective in future. Suggest that Sandra share intermittently about the work in the institute to help others move their work forward.
B. Enhancing policy	B. Topics related to policy to reflect on for future discussion. Please see: Suzanne Feetham's Blog on Policy: https://internationalfamilynursing.org/blog/ Highlights – nursing science is done in a policy context even if not directly realized. When you conduct policy in a specific field (science policy) – consider the social/political will, funding available, etc. Social and political will is important in moving the science forward. Enhancing policy is important to address health disparities and the nurse's role. Good potential for collaboration. Discussed possibility of getting feedback on the blog, to enhance the usefulness of this venue. Need to determine what is the best way to make this more interactive and useful as a means of communication for readers. Send any feedback on the blog to Suzanne. Suggest that we read through the blog for more discussion at future meetings. Lindsay has a press release coming out shortly related to policy and

	will keep us up to date on progress. Lindsay & Suzanne will get together for more formal discussion and collaboration.

Suggesting a separate meeting or a meeting for doctoral students and researchers at conference as students would like to be connecting with fellow students</p> <p>Need to present this possibility to the board as a way to keep the engagement going. May be difficult due to a full IFNC 14 schedule, but need to move forward ASAP with this possibility. Cindy will email June Horowitz, Sonja Meiers, conference planners and Debbie.</p> <p>Goals for a student networking opportunity would be good especially given that some students are being supported by IFNA to attend the conference. This could provide networking opportunity for new & emerging family researchers, support among themselves, plus connecting with other groups in the area to create groups that can work together. Potential for junior and senior family nursing researchers to come together - mentorships rather than large groups.
