	Fernanda M: shared her current research focus with families living with chronic conditions.	
	Suzanne F: encouraged participation in the 2 nd Family Research Workshop focused on Interventions and organized virtually sponsored by	

The Children's National Health System in Washington, D.C. on June 27 from 8:00-4:30. Registration has been extended to June 20.	
Lucilla N: teaching more than usual. Has joined the Cocoon Study and is getting the IRB submission prepared.	
Cyndi D: preparations under way to have research start up at her university. Modifying her protocol for her research data collection in family homes to ensure safety for the families and herself given the CoVID restrictions. Also waiting on response to an ROI grant submission.	
Debbie SL: preparing a TRIC (translating research into care) grant proposal in collaboration with medical faculty on family satisfaction within the NSHA(Nova Scotia Health Authority) ICU's. Finishing collaborative data collection with families of patients in long-term care facility that has had the highest number of deaths from CoVID in Nova Scotia. Shared that she has been offered the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing position at the university of Windsor in Windsor, Ontario.	
Petra B: busy in South Africa salvaging student projects that were affected by CoVID interruptions in studies this term. Active with acute care research group. Involved with another research project teaching family nursing concepts through simulation.	
Barbie G: has been given approval to start her research back up again but has not been able to access the families who are participants due to CoVID. She has an opportunity to write a supplemental article for her K23 study.	
Wendi S: "Terminology of Family, Person, Child Centered Care" in press. PhD studies have been on hold for now. She has joined a writing group at Villanova where they support each other, and she plans to bring the ideas she is gathering from this group with the IFNA graduate student's group.	
Paula N: shared news of her upcoming move to the University of Southern Maine.	

	Karyn R: making a permanent move to the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee starting in the fall, 2020. 50% of her position will be working on an ROI. She has had a scoping review accepted for publication and working on another submission of her dissertation. She will also explore stigma & bias that has emerged from her research data with Kathy Knafl.
4. Reflection on COVID-19 & social distancing	 Lessons learned Cyndy needs protocol approved for data collection in family homes by the research office to be compliant with CoVID precautions. Sonya suggested that Cyndy share her approved protocol with Paula for dissemination via IFNA communication channels such as the web site under research resources section. Barbie is starting her research again with guided by different scenarios for how to start research again with specific guidelines that creates a challenging process. Karyn R planning for online teaching with hopes of in person classes. Large classes may be organized in a hybrid manner. Getting back into practice settings for clinical experiences is a major focus but has not been worked out yet. Debbie shared that eastern Canada is also in a similar position where plans are underway for online learning with hopes for in person for small classes and clinical details are not finalized yet. Simulation has been planned online for some clinical. Suzanne F. shared that a pediatric journal editorial was cited in senate hearings and this was a landmark moment for nursing and its impact during CoVID. Suzanne offered to share the link to the proceedings.

7. Policy: Enhancing policy	 Suzanne Feetham & Lindsay Smith A very interactive discussion on enhancing policy engaged the committee. Summary points include: Suzanne passionately shared a Smithsonian article that highlighted Florence Nightingales pioneering impact on Policy and her recognition as a leader in how to communicate to policy makers and influence decisions. Suzanne also shared the story of Lauren Underwood, a 32-year-old nurse elected to the House of Representatives and her role in influencing policy. It was suggested that CoVID is having impact worldwide on practice, research and health care policy as was evident in what IFNA members have shared. Policy is a primary determinant of health with further application in research required with in depth analysis of policy impact and role. Lindsay joined later and his perspective will be shared in a future meeting.
