Several projects with five PhD's which are quite broad.</li> <li>Lindsay S.– chosen to be an international consultant for international journal of children's spirituality.</li> <li>Debbie SL setup and leads the COVID response team at the University of Windsor. Working on a virtual health study.</li> <li>Cindy D. – dealing with the effects of students with COVID. Working and having good progress on the R21 grant. Two</li> </ul>

One in March and another RO grant to bring in family component for June related to healthy eating (mountain quest which is a computer game).</li> <li>Eric H. – looking for summer submission with RO grant. Developing focus groups with black and Hispanic families who have infants or toddlers to do some intervention methods. Different components of the RO1 intervention as well as key topics and community interests and what their thoughts/suggestions are on the plans to connect well with the community. Currently working on manuscripts and one with the American Academy of Nursing looking at how structural racism is related to pediatric obesity.</li> <li>Junko H. – submitting manuscript by end of January. In research- collaborating with nursery school and kindergarten to study how to prevent transmitted COVID19 and submitted a grant.</li> <li>Brite Ø. – shared+ the EU application and a decision is forthcoming in May. Writing an article on comparing family members before and during COVID19 and collaborating with Iceland.</li> <li>Karyn R. – received her first publication. Two of secondary analysis on data manuscripts are drafted and final analysis is close to being completed. Genetic reports testing is done (out of 57 children 30 have a gene variant or more).
