1. Welcome (Call to Order) And approval of minutes	Called to order at 705 am adjourned 8am	
2. Member Updates on Current Research Projects	<p>Deb SL Students are on board for the practice committee project. They have 2 Canadian students and 1 student in Spain, looking for stories of family nurses. This project is NOT just IFNA nurses. Look for at least one story student project, regarding nurses who had to <b>shift their practice</b> during COVID and work with families and what did it look like. If members can share at least one contact with Debbie she will pass on to students. Examples are What kinds of things did nurses have to do to adjust practice, for example healthy family programs were lost and public health nurses could no longer go into the homes so they had to find different ways to get access to families</p> <p>Junko has new research as a nurse scientist looking at Japanese children communication with doctors, as the children are not informed of their disease due to parents' wishes. She is interested to know what is being done in other countries in this area, as families are very important to decision making for patient treatment.</p>	Cindy D will connect Hannah and Valerie the larger Research committee

Lindsay data collection started on the Australia/ New Zealand study on attitudes of nurses in caring for families (? Need to clarify this).

Valerie almost finished enrollment in her RCT, which is a CBT intervention looking at its effectiveness for parents of children dependent on technology. Self-management, mental health etc. 9 months of data collection. Manuscript submitted about virtual recruitment and video chat platforms for research. Parents do self collection of hair detailing how to shift this collection to home video etc. Academy of Nursing study looking at families of kids with special healthcare needs during COVID and systems of care.

Hannah working on a QI project looking at simulation for families of kids dependent on technology, will present poster at the hospital research day. Working on a manuscript and poster presentation of a study which looked at employee vaccine rates. Dissertation looking at burnout and stress of healthcare providers who worked during the pandemic is in IRB.

Cindy D her event history calendar work is going forward. Manuscript being worked on from the family workshop at IFNA. Defining family manuscript being worked on. Pediatric cluster fathers engagement review manuscript is in the analysis stage.

Barbie enrollment for her K is done. She had 650 encounters, and under 200 left to code. Working on a Delphi study to create a definition of family engagement specifically for those families of those who are newly vent dependent. Continues to work on a tip sheet for families involved in research with IFNA subgroup and fathers engagement manuscript with pediatric cluster.

Petra working on setting up the Africa chapter of IFNA. Research on family focused nursing review for Africa. Working on how to add more family nursing content into undergrad programs. They have had this content in the grad programs. Consider having her present about how they did this to the education committee.

Frank working on manuscript for the data from his dissertation. Thus far 2 manuscripts have been published. Dissertation will conclude in spring of 2023. Focus is family nursing practice in Uganda, quasi intervention for nursing in the ICU for family members. Another project is a group from 2 other universities in Helsinki and Olu, on reducing prolonged sitting time for workers, a large cohort.

Mary Ann scoping review on the family nursing in Africa—almost done, that will feed into future research

Internal grant in process for genetic study titled Exploring genotypic and phenotypic characteristics of youth with obesity and hyperphagia and their families: A pilot study. Continuing to work with the pediatric cluster on father's engagement review.</p>
