2. Approval of Feb. 23, 2021 minutes		
3. Member Updates on Current Research Projects	<p>Mandie: Back in NZ, participating in IFNA peds father's engagement. Many other projects happening. She will be resigning from ECU in Perth and remain as adjunct to do research and is currently looking for an academic position in NZ. Difficult decision to leave ECU but needing to remain closer to home.</p> <p>Willyane: Working on a project with what are the experiences of Brazilian fathers with babies that are breastfeeding, and how this is affected by the pandemic. Currently 6 participants, 4 mothers and 2 fathers, difficulty recruiting during COVID as the interest is low due to the seriousness of the pandemic in Brazil.</p> <p>Suzanne: Remind people to register for IFNA registration closes on April 21st. Students can do just the preconference if not the full. Working on the expert lecture and still looking for people to send her definitions of FAMILY in research and how that informs the design,</p>	

	<p>methods, and measures in their research. NIH has put out a request of information RFI on how to decrease racial bias in research. Please check this out and submit information, as this is influencing science policy.</p> <p>Karyn: Submitting manuscript secondary analysis looking at weight stigma. Dyadic analysis looking at mother/adolescents' views of weight management draft hopefully out in a month. Manuscript looking at genetics and obesity getting to the end. IFNA peds cluster systematic review is moving forward. Will focus on grant writing this summer and no teaching. Will be looking at writing a K23 training grant in the next year or so.</p> <p>Debbie S. Lemoine: Wrote a grant for the Nursing practice committee for IFNA and they also received funding. Doing digital stories and experiences of nursing for IFNA project. Busy in her role as dean. Still involved with implementation science on the east coast and will be presenting at IFNA on this. Some research has been put on hold due to COVID.</p> <p>Cindy D. Working on resubmitting an R01 to the NIH, habit formation with parent/preschool dyads. Working on getting her R21 back up and running, using event calendar. Working on a couple of manuscripts. IFNA Peds group received funding from Glenn Taylor. 21 members of that group and moving forward.</p> <p>Eric H. Unexpected faculty death in a senior faculty and lost another colleague last week in another institution. Mentorship for IFNA trying to connect on that soon to see how they can leverage the existing profiles rather than creating a whole new page. Item to present at the board level about adding the piece of membership renewal about whether they might want to be a mentor or mentee. Looking forward to IFNA.</p>
