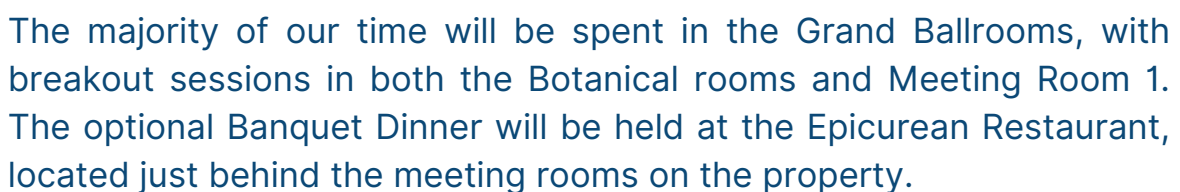

Minette Coetzee

PhD, RPaedN, RN, RComN, fANSA, fABPN



Minette Coetzee, PhD, RN is an Associate Professor in the Department of Paediatrics and Child Health at the University of Cape Town and Director of the Harry Crossley Children's Nursing Development Unit. Based at Red Cross Children's Hospital, she leads efforts to strengthen children's nursing across Africa through nurse-led education, research, and leadership development. Minette has helped establish 10 accredited nursing programs in 7 countries, adding over 1,400 children's nurses to the region's workforce. Her work focuses on translating evidence into locally relevant, best-practice nursing care to improve outcomes for children and families.

Dr. Sakiko Kanbara

PhD, Professor, Kobe City College of Nursing | Japan



Dr. Kanbara is a global leader in disaster nursing and founder of EpiNurse, a UN Risk Award-winning initiative. Her research spans disaster risk reduction, planetary health, and inclusive care, with a focus on multicultural and digital innovation. She has led transdisciplinary projects across Japan and Southeast Asia, integrating nursing, public health, and technology. In 2024, she chaired the 8th World Society of Disaster Nursing Conference, promoting global collaboration for crisis resilience.

Bep Uink

Professor, BPsych(Hons), Master of Applied Psychology (Clinical)



Professor Uink is Director of the Australian Indigenous HealthInfoNet at Edith Cowan University and an Honorary Associate at the Kids Research Institute. A Noongar woman and experienced leader, her work focuses on the social and emotional wellbeing of Aboriginal youth. She leads major research projects on racism, allyship, and mental health, securing over \$6.5 million in funding. Prof. Uink has held key roles at Murdoch University and Kulbardi Aboriginal Centre, and was a 2022 NAIDOC Perth award runner-up.

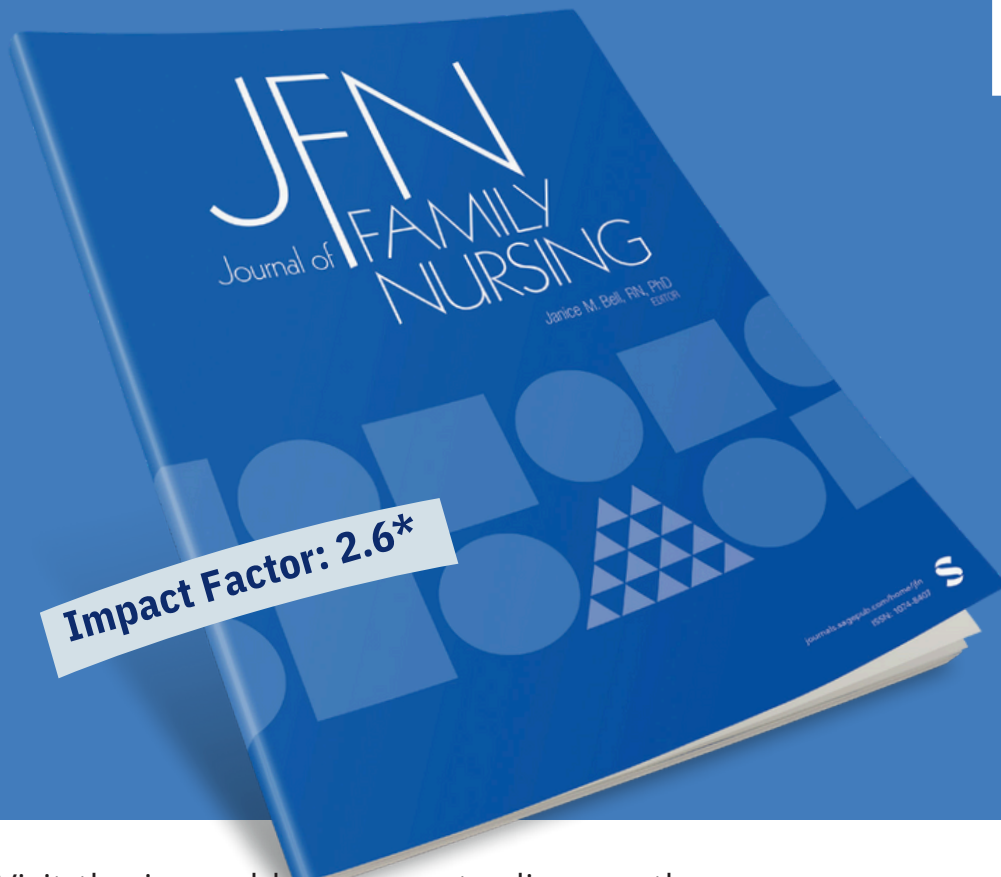

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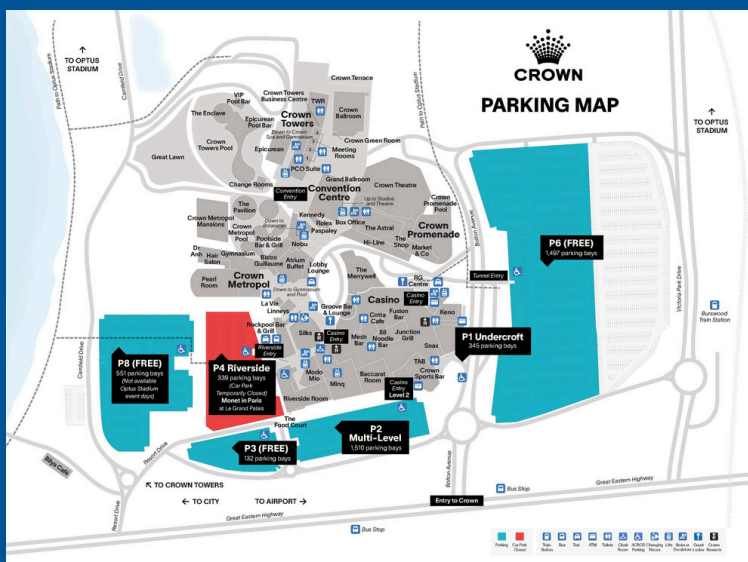
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
