Discussion	Discussion about the IFNA financials led by Barbara Giambra and Petra Brysiewicz. With a lot of
	the members in the older age group, there needs to be a discussion on new ways to improve
	membership and the financial balance.
	Hans-Peter de Ruiter asked about how the conference works out which country to have the
	conference in.
	June Horowitz shared that the conference in Australia was voted by the members, and it was the
	combination of several factors which caused the lower numbers.
	Kim Mooney-Doyle noted that travel needs to be balanced across different countries.

Barbie Giambra shared how the conference committee does negotiate with the conference place to enable the best cost. The conference number analysis highlighted the high number of first-time attendees at each conference. Petra Brysiewicz noted that having the conference in a place where there is a lot of support to attend can assist in the numbers attending the conference. A lot of factors influence each conference and although the committee reviews and tries to reduce the impact, there is always factors that cannot be controlled. The Australian conference had lower numbers of attendees. How can we link into the local nurses and hospitals. Junko Honda noted that linking into the country liaisons can help. Barbie Giambra noted that the Australian conference had a strong local committee but this is a challenge of how to connect with the local universities and health organisation. Can different presentation days be put in place for clinicians and hospital organisation to enable a stronger connection. Teresa Gutierrez-Aleman shared the importance of the chapters for new members and conference attendance. Junko Honda shared how being able to have an announcement at the end of the conference or at least early enables planning for funding. Petra Brysiewicz shared how they are working towards not only the 2027 conference but future conferences as well. But this does come with risk when committing future conference venues. Hans-Peter de Ruiter shared how there are a range of family scholars who are not active members. Petra Brysiewicz shared how family nursing is not an international concept can be confused with community health, and this reduces the visibility of IFNA. Younger generation of nurses / researcher joining an organisation is not high on their priorities. Debbie Sheppard-LeMoine asked if the places which have had a family workshop have a high IFNA membership? Teresa Gutiérrez-Alemán shared an international project being developed by IFNA members, which consists of a document analysis of generalist nursing professional frameworks from 30 countries. This analysis explores if and to what extent family is included as part of nursing practice and competency. She will share the results in more detail with the Board once they are published. **Action point** Petra asked the board to continue to think about this and when reading the strategic plan, what innovative ways can IFNA develop to boost membership and conference attendance.

Unlike the ones we would like to develop, these were not made with an international / multi-disciplinary audience in mind. 	<ul> <li>Scoping Review on the use and dissemination of the IFNA-PSs (Already completed between the Practice and Education Committees, and submitted for publication).</li> <li>International Document Analysis: A document analysis has been completed, with initial findings presented at IFNC17. A manuscript based on this work is now in preparation for submission to an international journal.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Focus Groups: Focus groups with an internationally and culturally diverse sample are underway to gather current and future perspectives on the IFNA-PSs. A recruitment reminder was recently sent, and content analysis is scheduled to begin in November.</li> </ul>
	Dissemination: Two project team members will present findings at the Transcultural Nursing Society 51st Annual Conference in Portland, ME (October 29 - November 1, 2025). They have requested IFNA promotional materials from Debbie and Petra to share with this audience.
